# CHAIRMAN'S REPORT Graeme Neilson

#### Introduction

It is my pleasure to welcome you all to the Annual General Meeting of the Bay of Plenty Badminton Association. As chairman, I am proud to share with you the progress, achievements, and challenges that have shaped our journey over the past year. This report reflects our commitment to nurturing a vibrant badminton community, continuing our massive growth in school participation, advancing competitive excellence, and promoting inclusivity within our association.

#### **Overview of the Year**

Over the past year, our association has seen significant growth within school participation, AIMs games, local tournaments, interclub and national competitions. These accomplishments are a direct result of the dedication of our board, staff, coaches, volunteers, and the unwavering support of our member clubs, players and parents.

Delwyn is a driving force behind our association's success! Her commitment, passion and connections within badminton circles and communities is highly effective in gaining access to halls, schools and community events.

It is particularly pleasing to see that Badminton is continuing to rank highly (and trending upwards) as a preferred sport within Bay of Plenty schools. This bodes well for the future of Badminton within the "Bay"

# **Strategic Focus**

- The board is looking to build on the work done in past years as it reviews the current strategic plan and develops a new 4-year strategic plan which will take us through to 2030. It is anticipated that we will be working with a purpose-built facility in Tauranga and Rotorua and looking at Whakatane next!
- The board is also working through a new constitution as part of complying with the Incorporated Societies Act. It's pleasing to hear that our associated clubs are well on their way to having their constitutions updated as well!
- The annual Delegates meeting with the board was once again, very successful and enlighten us to the challenges and needs of our member clubs. The resounding concern was being overwhelmed with club members and casual players. This is both exciting and problematic. Financially, this is very beneficial! However, the downside is, diminished court time and player satisfaction! This is of real concern!

• The board, alongside Delwyn and the trustees of BOP Badminton Facilities Trust are focused and working hard to ensure that our member club capacity issues are addressed! The purpose-built facility in Tauranga is making great progress with both the resource and building consent applications underway! We are targeting a June 2025 funding window with NZ lotteries, this is critical to our success. The board and Trust appreciate to support that we have received from both member clubs and Tauranga City Council.

# **Financial Health and Sustainability**

- The 2024 Financial year has been particularly challenging! The association relies heavily on grant funding for both events and salaries/wages. This last year has seen a notable shift for some funders away from funding salaries/wages which is highly problematic for the association given that we have limited sources of income generation. The board is very focused on ensuring that all events are profitable and are equally insistent that there is a "user pay" principle applied, but it's simply not enough! The new facility can't come soon enough! However, in the meantime, the board is focused on ensuring that we don't lose our current momentum, which fuels our future!
- The BOP Badminton Association finished the Financial year with a loss of (\$60,124) which is a product of two key items: Final facility development expense of \$35,350 (covered by hall funding account) and less than anticipated grant revenue (funded by reserves). The forecast cash budget shows a modest surplus which is important to our current financial needs.
- The greatest challenge for the board is to develop a strategic pathway towards financial sustainability as we transition from our reliance on grant funding which is becoming too unreliable and uncontrollable.

# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT Delwyn Cooper

It has been an extremely busy and productive year for the BOP Badminton Association.

I firstly would like to say thanks to all the Club committees across the BOP region for the time and effort you consistently put into providing a positive place in your local communities for people to be able to come and play badminton. Player numbers across the region keep growing which while fantastic can also create some issues. Keep up the good work!

I would like to acknowledge Tarryn Espitalier for her hard work and commitment to the work she does with both the Events that she runs across BOP and the Coaching work she does with schools and young players. Our numbers of players in the intermediate and secondary school space continues to grow and we have seen badminton rank #2 played sport (after games) in the 2024 Voice of the Rangitahi.

It was Donald Koh second year working for us as the CoachForce Coach & Development Manager. He brought with him a wealth of playing and coaching experience to Bay of Plenty, and he continued to grow his influence in the coaching space for our rep players and in the schools that he has visited!

I would also like to thank all the people who coach, manage, and support our rep players and players in clubs and schools and the volunteers at our events throughout the year – we couldn't do or achieve everything we have without your contributions.

I would also like to thank the BOP Board members for their continued belief and support that they give me in this role – it means a lot. Badminton is continuing to grow in the Bay of Plenty and I'm excited to see what challenges and successes we will see in 2025!

# **FUNDING & FINANCES**

# FEES

We are very reliant on the payment of affiliation fees from our member clubs, the receipt of player fees for inter-association, fundraising initiatives, and entries from local competitions. To remain viable, it is essential that all clubs within the BOP affiliate and share the costs of running our Association.

BOPBA started using the Friendly Manager platform for all the pre-season event registrations, trial registration and rep team information and invoice generation in 2023 and now is our standard way for people to register with us. We now have a good database of people and made invoicing for these things more streamlined in 2024.

BOPBA pays for the Friendly Manager platform for all affiliated clubs, but to date, only a few are using this consistently. With the changes to the Incorporated Societies Act and the updates that clubs are required to do with their constitutions, using the system ticks the box for some of the requirements under the act.

Friendly Manager has also confirmed that they are working on the links between clubs and associations in 2025, so we look forward to being able to get more certainty around who is playing badminton across our region and be able to get information out to them.

This will also give us an avenue to attract & develop sponsorship \$\$.

# GRANTS

We currently have limited income streams, and we depend on the successful outcome of our many applications for grants from Charitable Trusts and are extremely grateful for the support we received from these sources. Without these grants, the cost of participation in competitive badminton would be prohibitive for many.

In 2024 we received funding or partial funding from:

- **BAY TRUST / SPORT NZ / SPORT BOP** Continued support for the Coach Force Program and Tu Manawa sport Program

# **RESERVE ACCOUNT**

We continue to put money in monthly to a Saving Account which was established for the purpose of accumulating an emergency fund.

# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE / HARDSHIP ACCOUNT

We developed a Financial Assistance policy and application so that we might be able to support younger players to play badminton whose families struggle financially. We have a separate bank account for which we can take donations from clubs and individuals who would like to support this initiative.

# COACH FORCE / TU MANUWA SCHOOLS PROGRAMMES

We have successfully negotiated another fixed term agreement to the end of 2026 with an option to renew for a further year cycle in August 2026.

It is imperative that we continue to be involved with Sport BOP and the Coach Force program as it has made a significant difference to the profile of Badminton in the region.

We received some support from Sport BOP through the Te Manawa Major Fund. We were successful in securing funding so that we could run 'After-School' Sessions and 'Nor-Rep Tournaments'. We received this funding towards the middle of 2023 but were unable to

secure hall bookings until 2024. We organised 'Have a Go' sessions and nine non-rep tournaments (3 in each sub-region) in the 2024 season which were well received.

#### TAURANGA HALL

We have been making steady progress on the Tauranga Facility!

A new BOP Badminton Facilities Trust has been set up and we have managed to secured funding with Tauranga City Council for the next phase of work which is the Resource Consent, full building plans and costings and Building Consent.

Apollo Projects will be undertaking all this work late 2024 and the first few months of 2025. We are hoping to have building consent by June 2025 which will allow us to approach NZ Lotteries and other funders (as we have been advised that we need building consent for these applications).



We will be pushing hard in 2025 to raise the significant funds that will be needed!

#### BRANDING

We are still working hard to get our brand out in the public with both the sign written cars and also across our website and social media posts.

Our new representative player shirts have our new branding also!

This is an area that we still need to develop further – we will be looking at how we can market ourselves better in 2025! Watch out for regular newsletters this coming year!



# COACHFORCE COACH & DEVELOPMENT MANAGER'S REPORT Donald Koh

My second season with BOP Badminton just passed in March and I'm looking forward to greater heights in 2025 and beyond at BOP Badminton.

As I pen down my thoughts for 2024, I reflected on my first year, how things have changed and evolved for the better. In 2023, we implemented a basic coaching structure with training programs mainly targeting fitness, basic techniques, awareness on court etc. for our players in Rotorua, Whakatane and Tauranga. This is to ensure that our players are getting some form of training, guidance, motivation etc. to start with and to continue this process for years to come. The overarching message is to have badminton players connected to BOP Badminton and Badminton is for Life.

In January of 2024, we had our first summer camp in Rotorua Hall and about 25 juniors signed up for the 3 days camp. The players, coaches and parent volunteers stayed overnight at Rotorua Hall for the duration of the camp, and they all had great fun! The takeaway for the camp was to build team cohesion within the juniors leading up to Nationals at Palmerston North and we were particularly pleased to see leadership initiatives emerging from some of the U17 and U19 players during the camp.

The training programs we implemented in 2023 resulted in better skilled players, higher consistency on court and stronger fitness resilience and this was evident during the 2024 Nationals at Palmerston North.

Overall, our players performed well with some good wins, our U17s blue team were champions in Division 2 and our U19s blue team were runners up in Division 2 also! Winning is great but it is the transformation of our players we see changing, the belief that they can now compete to win against players from other regions. We are all very proud of our players' achievements and these results hopefully would motivate our players to work harder and commit to more training.

2024 also saw some good individual achievements from our junior players, in particular Ansen Bee and Caleb Lim. Ansen Bee has numerous individual badminton achievements, and he was part of the 2024 Badminton New Zealand U17s National Squad and currently the U19s National squad. Ansen played an instrumental role in our U17 blue team at the Nationals not just winning all his matches without dropping a set but also rallied the team and elevated his team mates at crucial moments to win the Division 2 title.

As for Caleb Lim, winning a bronze medal at AIMS Games in 2024 was a huge boost for him considering he was struggling to know how to smash a year ago! Caleb is currently selected into the 2025 Badminton New Zealand U15s National squad, and we hope these achievements will inspire more juniors to follow their pathway and pursue their dreams.

The implementation of basic coaching structure and training programs in 2023 has helped us see some success in 2024. We don't see improvement in our players overnight but it's a long-term investment to build skills, consistency, fitness, trust between players and coaches etc. BOP region is huge, unique and often I refer to it as the "Bermuda triangle" (Tauranga/Rotorua/Whakatane). To date, I have added another 46,000kms in 2024 to my work horse car and now sitting at almost 90,000kms... and more to come.

True to our tag line "Badminton for Life", whether you are beginner players, social players, competitive players or performance players, we hope to inspire lifetime enjoyment playing badminton. 2024 also saw an increase in badminton participation for AIMS Games, non-rep competitions as well as more BOP School teams sent to the NZ Secondary Schools Nationals. Overall, it was great and rewarding to see our players improve and perform well at competitions and enjoying the process.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the BOP Badminton board for their continuous support and trust in me, both Delwyn and Tarryn, for their awesome support and keeping us going, and lastly, to all our players, parents and volunteers, without you, there would not be a badminton community. I look forward to an exciting 2025 together with BOP Badminton!

# EVENTS & SCHOOL PROGRAMS CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT Tarryn Espitalier

On my laptop I have labeled my file for all the events we had, "2024 - The Year that Was!" And it really and truly was the year that was!

There were 31 (I stand to be corrected) events that were run in 2024, while also doing some school sessions and trainings where I was able to.

We introduced non-rep junior tournaments in each region during the April, July and October school holidays. These were well supported with numbers in total across the 3 holidays being as follows: CBOP 88 players, EBOP 101 players and WBOP 122 players, showing once again that people in all communities just want to play. We had some players from Taupo that played in all the CBOP and WBOP tournaments, which meant they travelled quite a lot to get the opportunity to play in more competition. These tournaments will continue in 2025.

In 2024 we had an increase once again in the Zespri Aims Games, with 328 players. When I initially saw the numbers, I was like there is no way we are going to get through the week but surprise, surprise we sure did. It was an awesome week where 1607 matches were played but could not have been done without the support and massive hours from our volunteers and Delwyn Cooper and Donald Koh.

I would like to take this opportunity to say a massive thank you to all the volunteers that have assisted with the tournaments this year, whether its popping in at the school's tournaments and assisting for a few hours, or assisting with whole tournaments or just listening to some of the nonsense that gets spoken and having a laugh at the tournament control desk, trust me it helps more than any of you know.

To Delwyn and Donald, thanks for all you do and the ongoing support and often the calming ear that I need, because let's be fair, I need to be calmed down sometimes, thank you from the bottom of my heart.



#### 2024 BOP & NORTH ISLAND UNDER 13 & UNDER 17 CHAMPIONSHIPS

This event was held 19<sup>th</sup> – 21<sup>st</sup> April at the Queen Elizabeth Youth Centre.

We had 84 players enter from across the country, which was a bit disappointing but because the junior NZBL was being run on the same weekend.

It was the first tournament of the year where we were following the Balance is Better Let Them Play Campaign. This applied to the Ul3's, no coaching on court or behind the court was allowed. We had Donald Koh walking around to make sure this was being adhered to. It worked out well.

For the U17's on the other hand, coaches had to be Association accredited coaches, they were the only ones allowed court side.

Our Bay of Plenty players had some tough games but held their own in the division 2 & 3 section of the tournament. Ansen Bee the standout with winning the Boys Doubles U17, semi-finals for the Mixed Doubles and winning the U17 Boys Singles Division 3.

It was great to see our local kids on court playing competition, was some good practice for those who were in teams heading to Junior Teams Nationals in July.

Well done to all the players and a big **THANK YOU** to all the volunteers that assisted with the running of this tournament.

#### **ZESPRI AIMS GAMES**

We welcomed back 328 players, the biggest number of players we have ever had! I know I said that last year but just shows how our sport is growing across the country. Among those players were the Cook Islands, a few who came over from Matakana Island, they had to be back on the ferry by certain times to get back home every day.

We once again had the mixed doubles which is something we will carry on doing for the years to come.

We played 1607 matches over the 5-day tournament. There were a lot of long days, early mornings and late nights, but was worth it.

Thanks to all those BOP Junior Rep Players who helped as Court Controllers for the event – without you, this tournament would not run as smoothly as it did!




